What Is a Community Foundation?

A Tax-exempt 501 c 3 nonprofit, public charity created by and for the people of a geographic area, where individuals, families, businesses, and organizations establish charitable funds to support nonprofit organizations in the region.

What Is a Fund?

A fund is an entity of money established by donors for restricted or unrestricted purposes and held as an asset of the Community Foundation. Funds may be endowed or non-endowed.

Types of Funds

Unrestricted – grants support entire community

Donor-advised – donors who want to be actively involved

Field of Interest – donors select a certain area of focus

Restricted/Designated – donors select a specific nonprofit

Scholarship Fund – education or vocational support
